Passport Photographs

One passport size photograph needs to be included. This will be held on file for reference purposes. Your name is to be put on the reverse and then signed by the Group Leader to verify that you are the person who has made the application

Police Vetting Forms

This process will be explained by your Group Leader. Adults who reside in the Republic of Ireland will complete the **Garda Vetting Application Form**. The **Garda Síochána Vetting form** should be attached to this form.

Adults who reside in Northern Ireland are required [by law] to undergo an **Access NI Assessment** before they can work with young people. The **Access NI Assessment** clearance form should be attached to this form or alternatively apply for Access NI clearance online using the Scouting Ireland PIN which is available from the person approving your application.

Referees

- Two referees are required.

Suitable responsible people might be Teacher, Clergy, Garda/Police Officer, Peace Commissioner, Employer, Scouter.
(Applicant should seek their consent before nominating them)

- Only one referee can be a Scouter.
- **The person who signs the Approval cannot act as a Referee.**
- **Members of your family should not act as a Referee**
- Each referee should be aware that they are referees and will be contacted in the future.

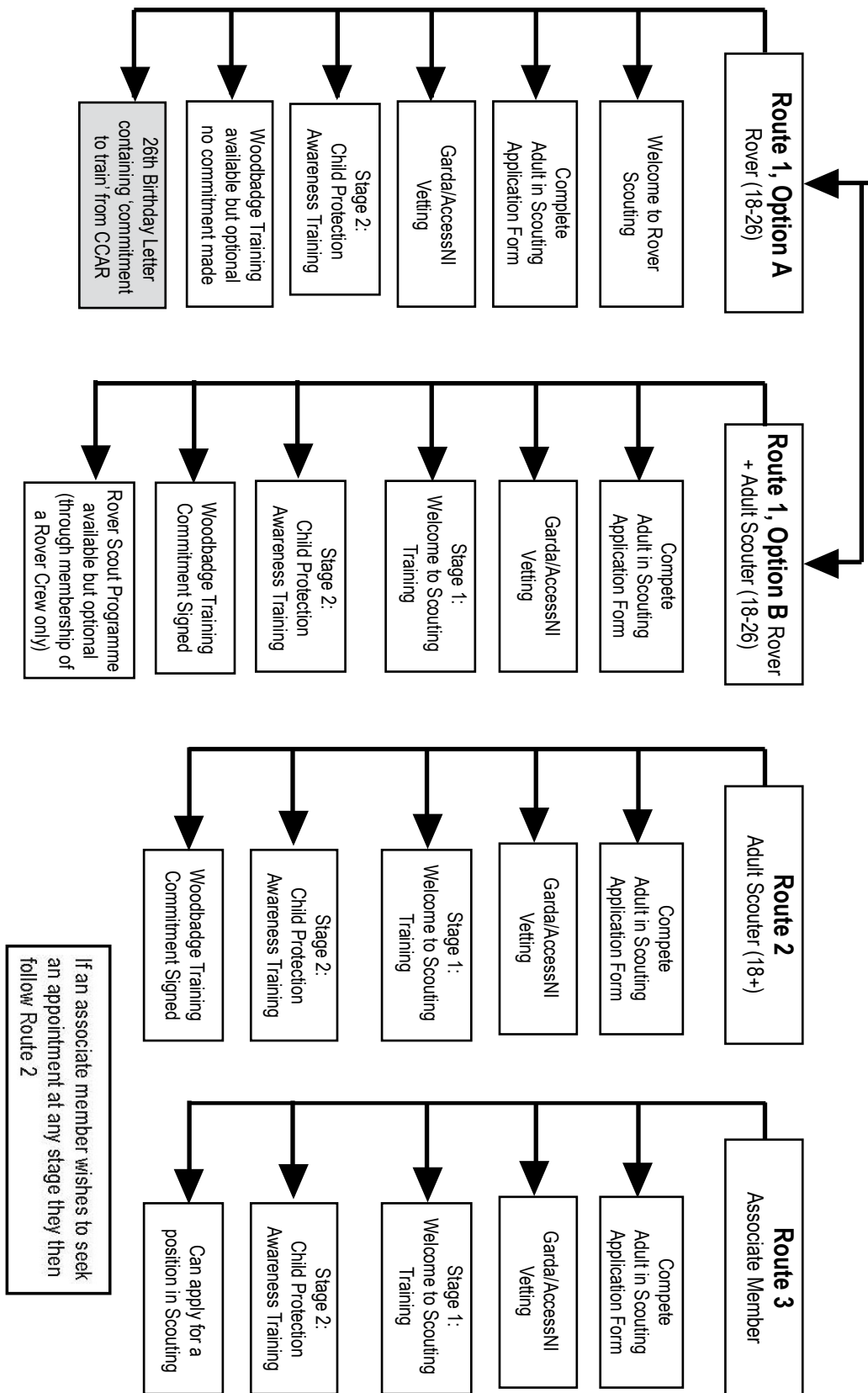
